

BARBARA SMITH SCHOLARSHIP RULES AND CONDITIONS, and APPLICATION DETAILS

The Barbara Smith Trust Fund was established to endow a scholarship to commemorate Barbara Smith's service to veterinary science and its promotion in Industry. Barbara Smith had an exceptional career. She was the New Zealand Veterinary Association's first woman President and became Vice-President of the World Veterinary Association. Barbara spent most of her career with Tasman Vaccine Laboratory (later ICI Tasman). She was a major force in establishing the credibility of veterinarians in Industry.

Trustees

The Trustees of the Fund are the New Zealand Veterinary Association Te Pae Kīrehe (NZVA) Board.

Objectives of the Scholarship

The objectives of the scholarship are to:

- a) promote and encourage research into animal remedies for use in New Zealand
- b) encourage veterinarians to share knowledge and experience, in order to benefit veterinary science
- c) promote, assist and encourage veterinarians to undertake research in veterinary clinical pharmacology
- d) publish and disseminate veterinary pharmaceutical research findings and any other literature that the Trustees' in their discretion think fit to educate the public in developments in animal remedies.

Eligibility

- a) Applicants must be New Zealand registered veterinarians.
- b) Applicants must be members of the New Zealand Veterinary Association Te Pae Kīrehe.

Procedure

- a) The scholarship will be advertised from time to time, as determined by the Trustees.
- b) The advertisement will give a closing date for applications, which may be extended if necessary.
- c) Applications must include the information listed at the end of this document.
- d) Completed applications will be referred to the Trustees of the Fund.

Conditions

- a) The value of each scholarship will be determined by the Trustees, up to a value of \$5,000.
- b) The scholarship will be a single payment.
- c) The term of the scholarship will be determined by the Trustees but will normally be one to two years.
- d) The recipient will be expected to write up the project within three months of completion.
- e) The project should be written up, preferably in the *New Zealand Veterinary Journal* or

Vetscript.

Applications

The applications should be **no more** than four pages in length **including** a one-page Curriculum Vitae (CV) for the applicant. The application should be made to:
